The legislative, contractual or other authority for the regulated charge	<p>Under section 306 of the Water Act 1989 (Victoria), the Minister of Water may delegate, by instrument, to any person or class of persons any power, discretion, function, authority or duty of the Minister under this or any other Act.</p> <p>The Minister for Water has delegated Goulburn-Murray Water functions and responsibilities as set out in the Instrument of Delegation dated 2 May 2003 and 20 June 2007 which include;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • prescribing fees that are for the issuing, varying or cancellation of a water use licences or water use registrations (instrument 20 June 2007 items 35, 37, 43 and 51 under section 64P(d), 64R, 64AI(1)(d) and 64AR(2)(d) of the Water Act 1989) • prescribing fees that are for the issuing, varying or cancellation of a works licence. (instrument 20 June 2007 items 60, 63, 67, 70 and 71 under section 67(2)(c)(i), 72(2)(c), 73A(3)(d), 74(4)(c) and 74AA of the Water Act 1989) <p>Under section 260 of the Water Act 1989 (Victoria), Goulburn-Murray Water has the power to set tariffs.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) An Authority that sets a tariff must do so by resolution. (2) A resolution under subsection (1) has no effect until the day on which notice of the making of the resolution is published in a newspaper circulating generally in the area concerned. (3) An Authority that sets a tariff must specify in the notice under subsection (2)— <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (a) the district to which the tariff applies; and (b) the method of calculating fees imposed under the tariff; and (c) the period for which the tariff is set <p>Under section 264 of the Water Act 1989 (Victoria) Goulburn-Murray Water has authority to set charges for any functions</p>

<p>A description of the process applied in determining the regulated charge including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the cost allocation principles; and • whether the regulated charge has been the subject of consultation, a review or audit and, if it has, a description of the process and a summary of the outcome 	<p>The regulated tariffs have been designed to recoup costs associated with the provision of the service provided. Where direct expenses are incurred to provide the service, these expenses are allocated directly to the cost of the service. Indirect expenses, ie. corporate related costs such as finance and human resources are allocated on varying basis according to their corporate requirements.</p> <p>The fees and charges for these services are regulated by the Essential Services Commission (Commission) in accordance with the Water Industry Regulatory Order 2003 (WIRO) issued under the <i>Water Industry Act 1994</i>.</p> <p>The process prescribed in the WIRO requires that prices be calculated or otherwise determined in accordance with the Regulatory Principles related to: recovery of operational, maintenance and administrative costs; recovery of expenditure on renewal and rehabilitation of existing assets; provide appropriate incentives for the sustainable use of water resources; and provide the regulated entity a sustainable revenue to meet efficient delivery of outcomes identified in the Water Plan.</p> <p>These charges were included in the 2013-16 Water Plan and subsequent pricing proposals that have been subject to regulatory review and public consultation prior to receiving the final determinations by the Commission. Consultation with customers occurred during the Water Plan and the subsequent Goulburn-Murray Water Blueprint published April 2013. Customers were advised of the tariffs to apply from 1 July 2015 by newsletter mail out, publication in the newspaper, media release and via the GMW website.</p>

The current fees listed apply from 1 July 2015.</p> <p>Fees for regulated tariffs in relation to Goulburn-Murray Water functions delegated by the Minister in administering and the management of the private diverter licensing and operation services, are for a wide range of water planning and water management activities. The fees are subject to an independent review. A Water Plan is prepared by Goulburn-Murray Water, for the Essential Services Commission (ESC) as part of the requirements for water industry regulation detailed by the Water Industry Regulatory Order (WIRO). The document details the needs of the business for the regulatory period, the latest being the 1 July 2013 to 30 June 2016. The document is developed in consultation with GMW’s customers for agreed service levels which influence service cost. The document is published on the ESC website in which the ESC invites the community to make submissions in response to the Water Plan.
